



WAKERING ROAD FOYER

London, United Kingdom 2009

This residence is built on 18,000 sq ft of land formerly occupied by a parking lot in the district of Barking. It is located near a busy road and rail transport. With 160 beds, it houses disadvantaged young people between the ages of sixteen and twenty-five—young parents, rehabilitated drug addicts, and those with physical and mental disabilities. They spend a maximum of two years here before returning to their homes.

An L-shaped complex, Wakering Road Foyer is made up of one two-story block and another nine-story building, which has a covered outdoor space on the first level and a roof terrace above. The nine-story tower's first and second levels contain administration offices. It is bisected by a glazed circulation "spine." This wing contains training rooms and communal spaces such as the laundry and a day care center, in addition to apartments.

The taller block is clad in precast glass-fiber reinforced concrete (GFRC) panels. The lower wing features a curtain wall in clear, translucent, and opaque glass. The tower cladding is an abstract composition of vertical panels that hide the dull and repetitive nature of the apartments. Colored glass fins cast colored shadows across the facades.

The complex is heated and cooled by means of a geothermal pump, to which a heat-recovery ventilation system has been added. Gray water from apartment showers is recycled for use in toilets. Parts of the building, such as the toilet modules, are prefabricated.

The complex is certified by EcoHomes, which is a version of the BREEAM (BRE Environmental Assessment Method) for new or remodeled homes, individual homes, or residential developments.





